## Principal's Report

Dear parents and carers,

#### **SAFEMinds**

On Friday 23 February, PCS had a student free day and all staff participated in SAFEMinds professional learning.

What is SAFEMinds? SAFEMinds is a professional learning and resource package for schools and families that enhances early intervention in mental health support for children and young people in schools; specifically regarding mild mood disorders and self-harm. It also assists in developing clear and effective referral pathways between schools, community, youth and mental health services.

SAFEMinds is a professional learning package for school staff that is underpinned by the NIP it in the bud! (Notice, Inquire, Plan) early intervention approach.

NIP it in the bud! provides a whole school approach to recognising and responding to the early warning signs of depression, anxiety and emotional distress. It is founded on a range of evidence informed child and adolescent mental health resources, and aims to provide schools with information and an approach to optimise wellbeing and minimise risks for children and young people within the school setting.

I hope this edition of the newsletter finds you well. Last week and this week our Year 3 and 5 students have been participating in The National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). NAPLAN is made up of tests in the areas of reading, spelling, grammar and punctuation and numeracy. I would like to share how proud I am of all of our students who are participating in NAPLAN and congratulate them on their efforts. Parents and carers will be provided with individual reports later in the year that show student progress on NAPLAN.

### **Attendance**

I would like to draw everyone's attention to the importance of attendance at school. Each day of school missed or late makes a difference, with the effect on learning accumulating over time. From an early age, if children are taught that they need to 'show up' for school and make a commitment, this positive mentality aids academic and career success and brings benefits in adulthood. ### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
