What does this mean to be in a composite class? A composite class contains children from more than one year level. The research suggests that there is absolutely no evidence that composite classes have a negative effect on teaching and learning. Teachers are used to teaching multiple academic ability levels in a classroom as we teach to the student's ability, not their age. For example, in a year 1 class, you will have students at the academic year Prep as well as students at year 2, possible year 3 level. This is nothing new to teachers. Composite classes are very different from years past.

There is a general agreement in educational research that suggests composite classes can have social and emotional benefits for students. For example, it is far easier to find someone to play with in a class of 18, than a class of 10.

Please keep an eye out for a fundraising survey that will be sent out in the near future.




Science and Sustainability Bulletin Week 7 Term 4 2023
